
First, a brief historical perspective...





Slides became a visual "Canvas" to tell a story

- Until Persuasion ~1988, used photo-based slides (\$\$\$)
- Once accessible in every PC, every presentation had to be visual.
- With the lights low, they were also passive.





By 1990 Xerox PARC added Interactive **whiteboards**

- Mirror whiteboard for remote meetings & classrooms.
- **@Covid: whiteboard software** key to hybrid meetings
- **Post-Covid**: feature for video tools Zoom, Meet, Teams, etc.





Canva's introduced this feature to compete in the whiteboard software market.

The family history market is different



Whiteboards create a **new** opportunity for **storytelling**. **Canva** is uniquely suited to **family history**.








Key to using it is to consider essential elements so it **tells stories**, is **archived**, and **private**, yet shareable.






Canva Whiteboards create an **infinite canvas** *UI is new, and, can be a little confusing*






Visual, yet flexible

- Shared anywhere mobile/web.
 - Easily converted to video or download & print.
 - Images, text, anything linked to anything else. Created in a few clicks.





One example ...

Canva templates, pieced together to suit.

Sourced from the Library of Congress, with full attribution.

Sourced from FamilySearch "fan," clipped and trimmed.

Family history book

Scanned & uploaded as images, highlights created as semi-transparent boxes.

From a personal collection, arranged against the timeline with linked lines connecting them like a yarn map.

Web pages embedded as relevant

Use the magic "/" and type "embed" to embed sites, pictures, documents, videos — almost any web link.

Don't let it scare you • UI elements are basically like any Canva, except...

 An infinitely large canvas Interactive (link, embeds, and commenting) Like any new tool, it takes a little getting used to. • Why not learn by playing? See updated <u>article in</u>





My favorite tricks (apply Canva-wide)

- Control+click (right-click) for a powerful menu of tools (align, bring to front, etc.) Use "Magic" menu for Al tools.
- Use the "Position" tool to precisely control placement.
- Navigating without moving things can be tricky. My favs:

• Use the Zoom

- Pinch/stretch on a pad OR
- Key commands+scroll





Creating & manipulating objects on a canvas

There's a collection of pre-made templates and objects you can select
 from "Elements", OR create your own with "/".

Settings across the top ribbon let you manipulate objects.

- Preset anchors, kerning, and leading seamlessly default things look good, or make it easy to adjust.
- "Position" tool is incredibly powerful for layers, alignment and rotation.

If you're frustrated that you can't create the way you do in other apps, just create there and import. Import/export to standards like PDF, JPG, and PNG.




Key point of caution: Sharing

- Sharing a whiteboard is sharing a link: It is NOT private.
- There are two ways to share (already confusing, right?)
 - Share as a TEAM
 THIS is a paid feature
 - Share as a LINK
 THIS is not
 BUT it's limited to either entirely private, or entirely public.




Key point of caution: Sharing

- Sharing a whiteboard is sharing a link: It is NOT private.

 - Personally, I use "anyone" BUT:
 - I carefully protect the link

- Gifts/shared visual, audio, and interactive stories ("two-ways" example)






