- **PITCH** — I'm not selling anything for anyone.

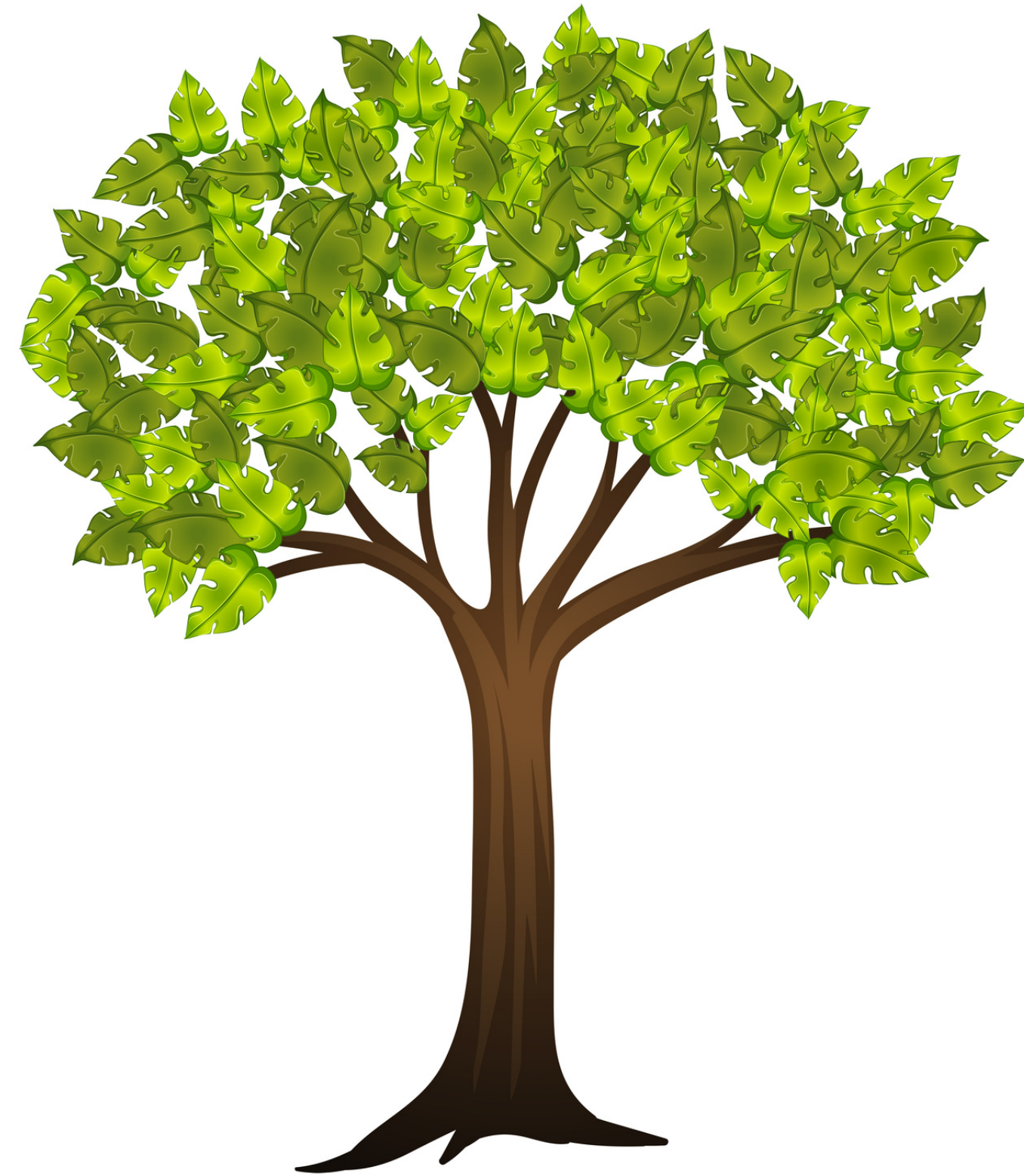
**IS a...**

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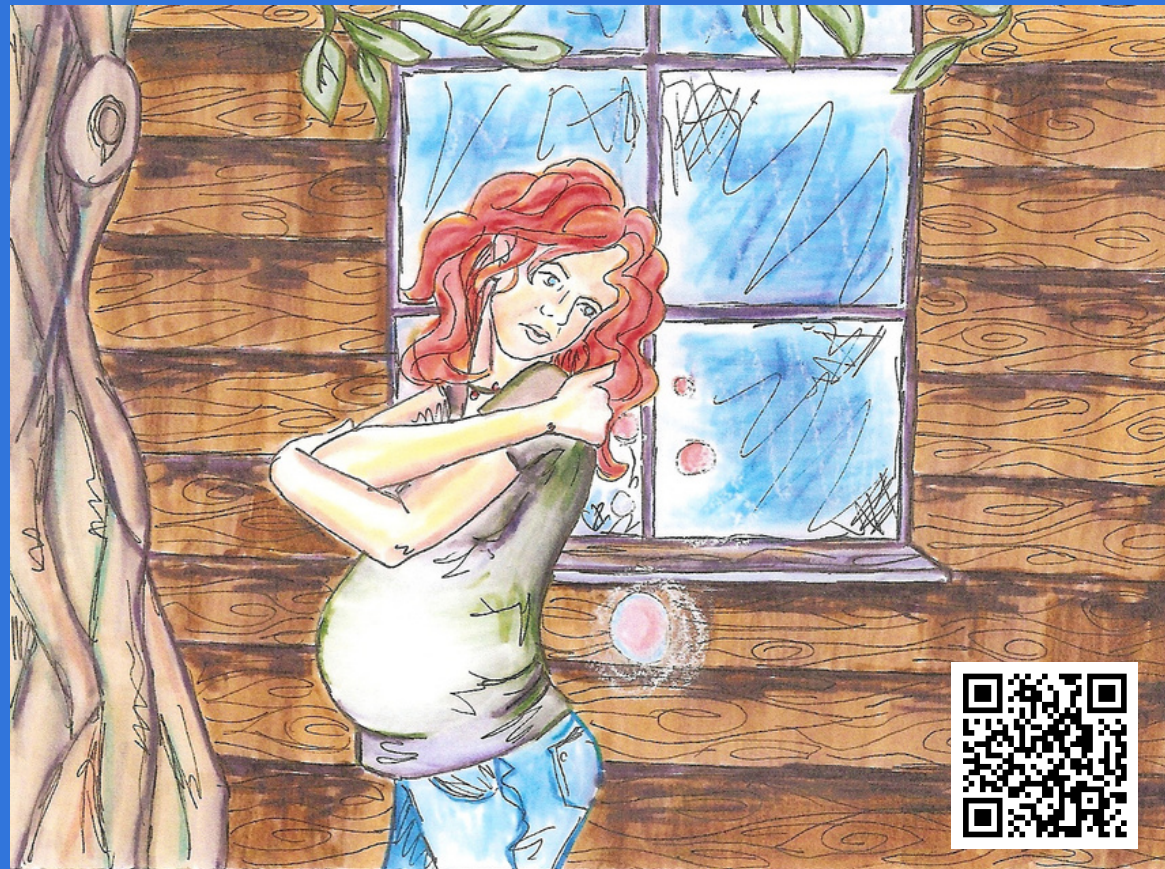

She glanced frantically behind her but the beautiful gossamer wings were gone and long red, mortal hair curled around her shoulders.

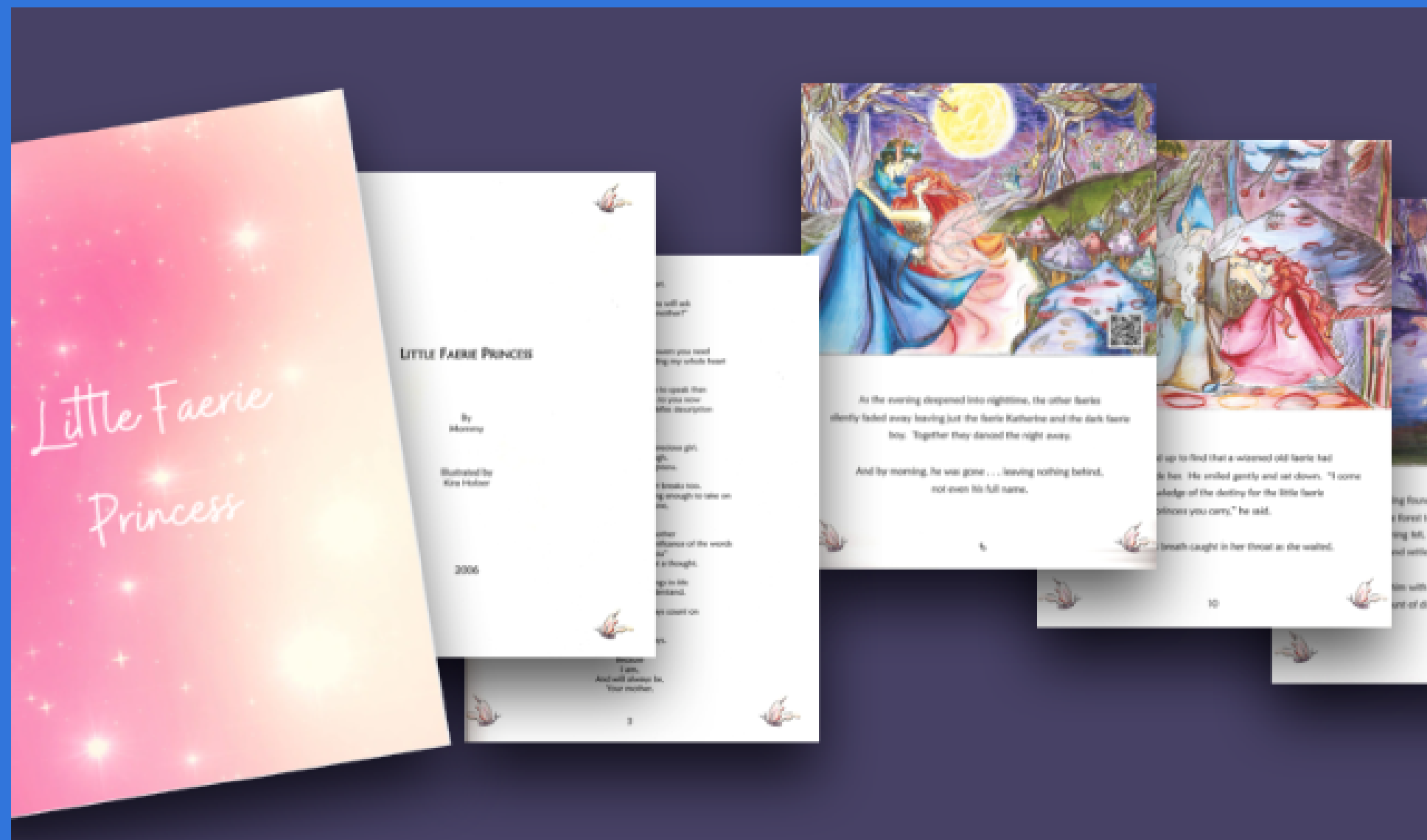
And as panic set upon her, she felt the joyful dancing of little hands and feet inside of her, and she calmed with knowing that this was the path that she must take.

- *Printed book with QR codes*

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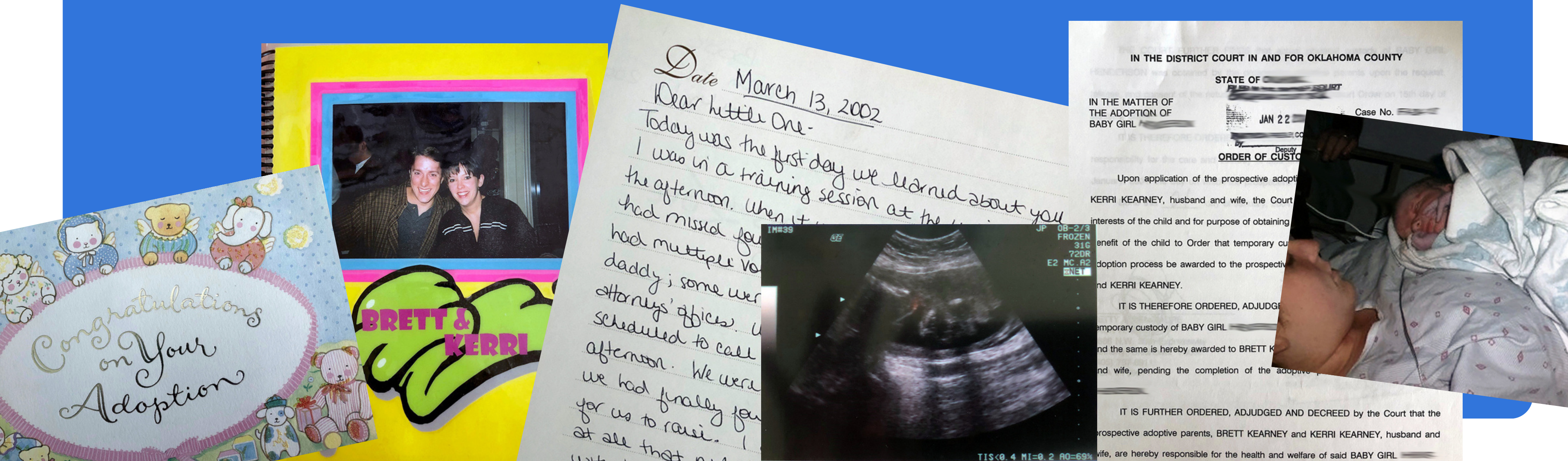

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Just like all family history, burls in the family tree often start with "stuff" ...





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In "the stuff" are the stories ...

and, for centuries,

stories have been used as **powerful teaching tools.**



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## MY GOALS . . .

- To make a story familiar and accessible from an early age.
- To frame the story in a way that details could be added as the child grew.
- To honor my child's right to her story.



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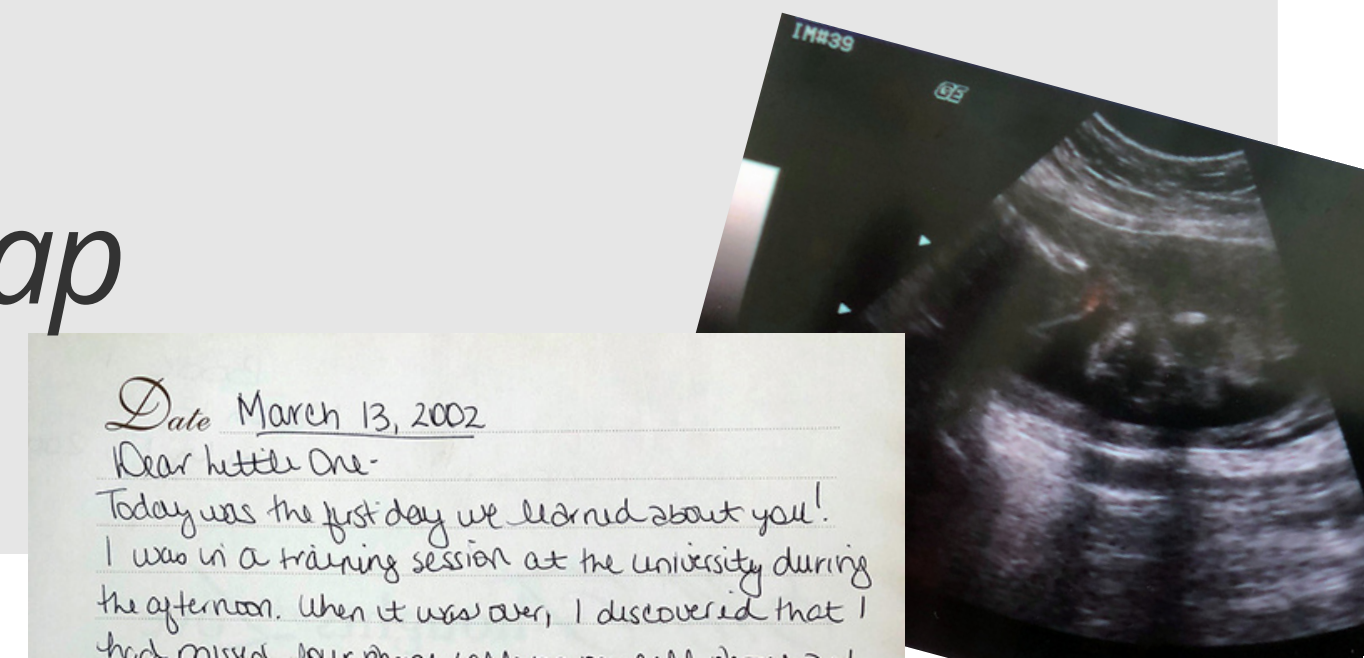
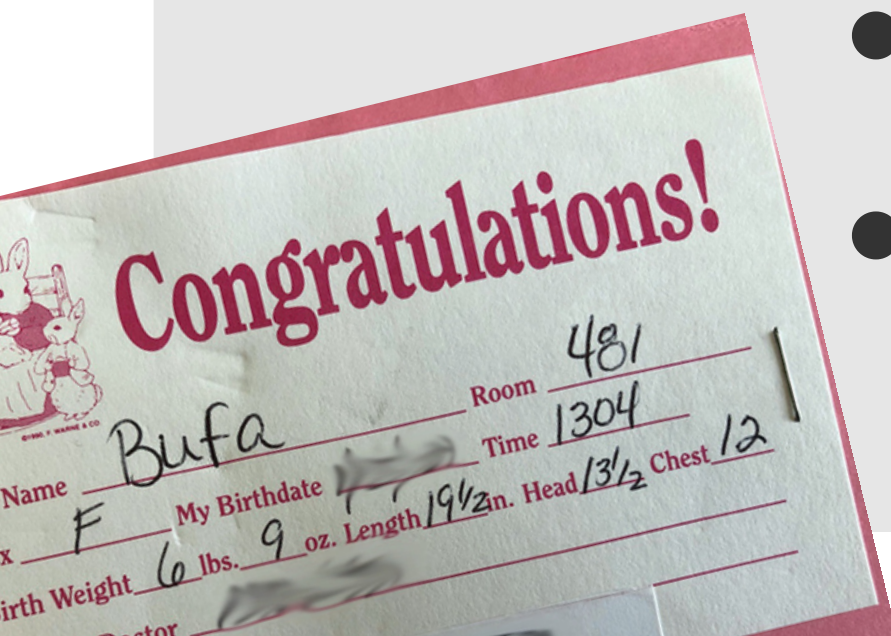

## Step 1: Plan the Story

- *What do you want the child to learn?*
- *What is age appropriate (plant seeds)?*
- *What are useful metaphors or frameworks?*
- *Use a co-author?*
- *Create an outline or story map*



*Children may create fantasy stories about some family situations. **Earn long-term trust** by:*

- *Sticking with the facts or fact-based representations*
  - *Children may struggle later if something they believed is not true.*
- *Leaving out pieces you don't know*
  - *Say "I don't know" when that is the truth*

## Step 2: Write the story

- *Look at some children's books to get ideas about structure and flow*
- *Invite the feedback of others*
- *Use an editor*
- *Be careful with the reading level / who will be the reader?*

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One month later, Dr. Bear exclaimed, "red hair!" as she delivered Isabella Barbara.

"Red hair?" Mom and Dad looked at each other in confusion.

## Step 3: Prepare illustrations

- *Clipart*
- *Photos*
- *Child's drawings*
- *Hire illustrator (check at your local high school!)*

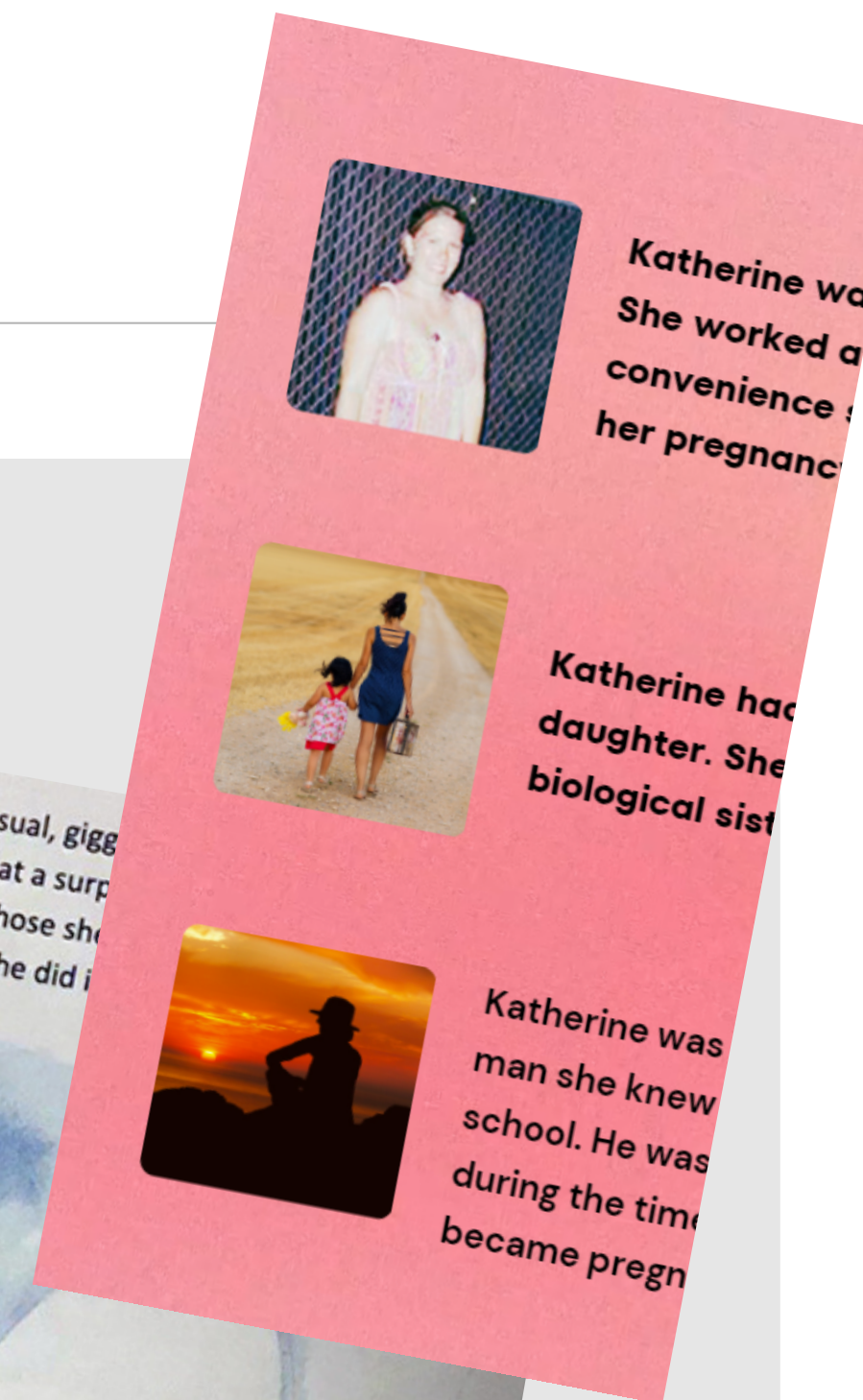


Then, suddenly, at one room way down the hall, a teacher named Ms. Tina said, yes, she was sure she had seen Mr. Cow somewhere. She thought and thought. Then she raced toward the gym.

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## To think about

- Use only **actual photos/representations** of a missing person . . . maybe digital formats only.
- Silhouettes and photos from the back are good substitutes.
- Lots of options for clip art and photos.



## Step 4: Plan the digital pieces

- *Which pages will be supplemented?*
  - *Narration (and they have your voice forever)*
  - *Music*
  - *Webpages (private pages are good option)*
    - *Bonus: You can add details to webpages as the child grows*

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## Step 6: Send it to production

- *Self publishing sites (I used Kindle Direct Publishing for my print book)*
- *Ebook software (I used Simple Booklet)*
- *QR code generator (I used Canva)*
- *Webpage maker (I used Canva)*



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**There are lots of teaching stories besides the hard ones!**

- *How a lost toy was found*
- *When we don't win*
- *Family traditions*
- *Animals on Papa's farm*
- *Origin stories for everyone*





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## When it's a hard story, talk to the child about privacy

- *Be clear that private is different from secret.*
- *Be clear about who owns the story.*
- *Once age appropriate, let the child decide who has access -- this is a balancing act in the early years.*
- *Let the child know they have the right to change their minds.*



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## Access for print books

- *Put print books on the shelf with others. Message:*
  - *Your story is "normal."*
  - *Your story is just as special as any other story.*
  - *You have a right to access your story whenever you want.*



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## Access for for ebooks and webpages

- *Consider the ease with which webpages and ebooks can be shared and take precautions as appropriate.*
- *Consider what device(s) the child accesses the story on, and how those may/may not be protected.*

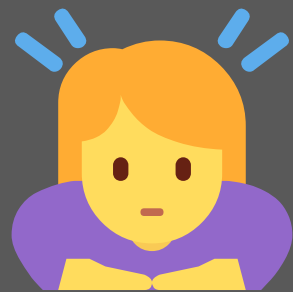
